Millstone Farm visit

Colleen reports that we had the opportunity for a farm visit to Heughan Gordon's Millstone Red Devon Stud on February 19th 2022. Despite Covid ramping up its presence, the day went ahead regardless. We had fewer numbers than we were expecting sadly as travel plans changed for many. A number of new members attended including one from the South Island, who flew up specially for the farm visit. The enthusiasm is great to see!



We were spoilt with a gorgeous Hawkes Bay day of sunshine and a gentle breeze - it made the day out a real pleasure. All the cattle were incredibly well behaved and didn't even mind all the new people walking through their paddocks.

The R2 bulls were first up – they were in very good order and displayed their good temperament throughout the large mob. These bulls are for sale if anyone is requiring a new herd sire for next season. They were nicely put together bulls with plenty of promise.



The cow mob had 55 x mixed aged Cows, all with calves at foot. The cows were good, sound Devons and doing a good job of their calves. These cattle are all grazed on steep hill country, they are sure-footed and very level headed, they HAVE to be on hills like that! It was great to see a nice big mob of Devons and all handling the conditions so well.



The herd sires were not at all interested in seeing us and disappeared over the horizon to the far gate. They had all just finished working for the season and were in good condition. There was quite a selection of bloodlines throughout them and again, good natured bulls.

The 30 odd maiden heifers were a VERY even line up and will join the herd this coming season. It was hard to pick the best as they were all nice looking heifers and really easy on the eye!



The 2 & 3 year old heifers and their calves were what I was very interested in seeing. They had been through a drought when they were young and Heughan had said they had recovered well. What a treat to see them. They were a standout line-up of quiet, young dams with fabulous calves at foot! There was absolutely no indication that these heifers had been through VERY dry times - they were in top condition. Again, the mob are running with sheep on steep country, so it was impressive to see them doing such a good job of their calves and themselves.



We were lucky to be treated to a full farm tour as we went around each mob. This made the day out even more interesting as we were 'chauffeured' around the farm and got to really appreciate the countryside.

We all headed back to the woolshed for a very enjoyable lunch and a cold one! The event was well thought-out and had a nice relaxing vibe. A big thankyou to Heughan and family for their hospitality on the day. All the effort that had been put in to make the day happen, was very much appreciated! Well done guys!

Marketing

As discussed in the last newsletter you will now see a last updated date noted prominently on the stock trade pages. Keep in mind that we have a page for both those selling and those seeking stock.

Currently we have a request from Mt Cass Station in Waipara in North Canterbury. They are looking for up to 30 Polled Bred R2 Heifers, ideally calving September, and 30 polled R1 weaned heifer calves. They are currently looking to shake up the genetics of their beef herd to better align

with the target market of their direct to retailer meat brand www.washcreek.co.nz . This interest is based in part on the multiple appearances of Red Devons in the steak of origin contest. Kudos to former member Graham Dyke for his participation and performance in those competitions.
